- creature [n] = something alive, e.g. *Fairies are strange little creatures with wings* [πηλάσμα]
- imagine [vb] = create sth in my mind, e.g. *The ancient Greeks imagined that twelve gods lived on Mount Olympus* [φαντάζομαι] → imagination [n]
- an imaginary creature exists only in my imagination
- myth → ancient people try to understand nature and imagine the gods and other mythical creatures
VS
fairy tale → imaginary stories about magical creatures that want to teach us sth
- oversized [adj] = big, large, e.g. *Cyclopes are oversized monsters with one eye*, [μεγαλόσωμος]
- strange [adj] = mysterious, e.g. *Jonathan saw a strange light in the forest*, [παράξενος]
- vicious [adj] = very bad and dangerous, e.g. *The vicious dog attacked me*, [άγπιος, κακός]
- frightening [adj] = scary, e.g. *The children are telling frightening stories* [τρομακτικός]
- good-hearted [adj] = with a good heart
with a big head: big-headed
with a long nose: long-nosed
with one eye: one-eyed
