- imagine [vb] = create sth in my mind, e.g. The

- an imaginary creature exists only in my imagination
- myth → ancient people try to understand nature and imagine the gods and other mythical creatures

fairy tale → imaginary stories about magical creatures that want to teach us sth

- oversized [adj] = big, large, e.g. Cyclopes are
 oversized monsters with one eye, [μεγαλόσωμος]
- strange [adj] = mysterious, e.g. Jonathan saw a strange light in the forest, [παράξενος]
- vicious [adj] = very bad and dangerous, e.g. The
 vicious dog attacked me, [άγριος, κακός]
- frightening [adj] = scary, e.g. The children are telling frightening stories [τρομακτικόs]
- good-hearted [adj] = with a good heart with a big head: big-headed with a long nose: long-nosed with one eye: one-eyed
