- delicate [adj] = small and easily hurt or broken, sensitive, fragile, e.g. *The little glass doll was very delicate* [ντελικάτος, ευαίσθητος]
- unpredictable [adj] = when someone or something is unpredictable you don't know what they're going to do or what is going to happen, e.g. *The weather in Britain is very unpredictable* [απρόβλεπτος]
- savage [adj] = vicious, wild, e.g. *Cyclopes are savage one-eyed giants* [άγριος, βίαιος]
- belly [n] = stomach [κοιλιά, στομάχι]
- fierce [adj] = angry and dangerous, e.g. *When her baby is in danger, a lioness is fierce* [άγριος, επιθετικός]
- keep vigil [exp] = stay alert and ready and watchful; watch and wait, e.g. *Polyphemus keeps vigil waiting for ships to come by* [ξαγρυπνώ]
- spot sth [vb] = see, notice, e.g. *I spotted a strange little bird in the tree* [προσέχω, εντοπίζω]
- a loyal friend is a good and faithful friend [πιστός]
- delightful [adj] = very nice
- nasty [adj] = very bad
- wicked [adj] = tricky and mean

- disgusting [adj] = very unpleasant, e.g. *Ogres are disgusting creatures* [αηδιαστικός]
- hideous [adj] = very very ugly [κακάσχημος]
- monstrous [adj] = gigantic, enormous [τερατώδης]
